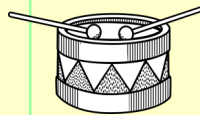

 Come in for open play to build skills needed to start Kindergarten. **No registration required.**



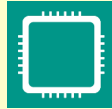
Reading with Animals

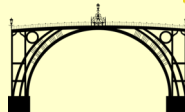
Tinker Tuesday: Snap Circuits
